



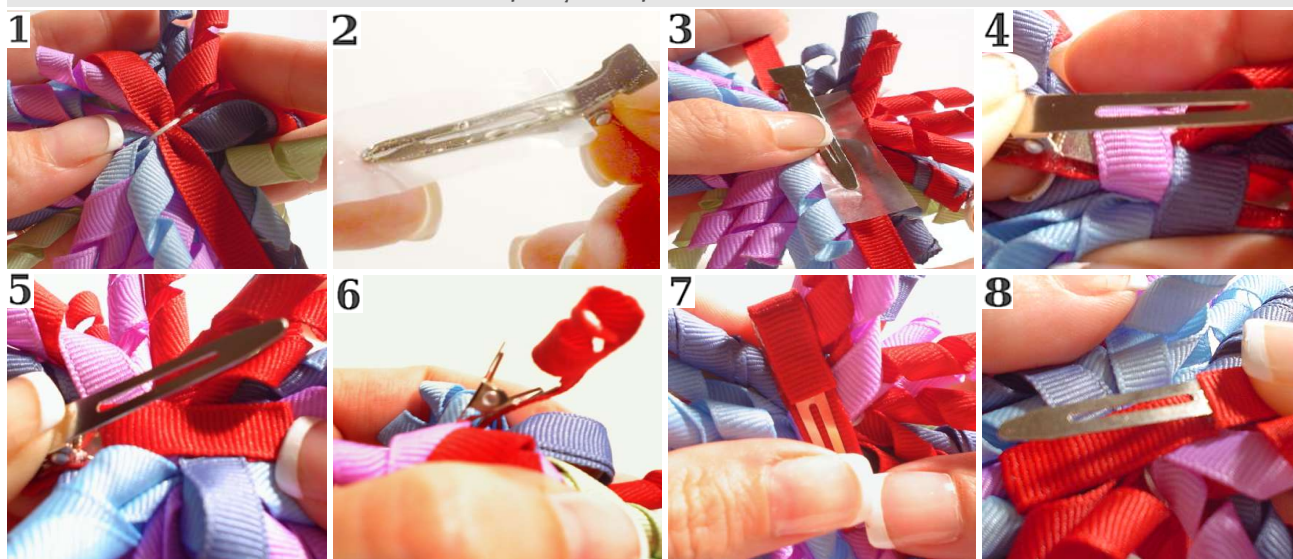
### Materials for Attaching Korker Bows to an Alligator Pinch Clip:

- 1 korker bow (pages 15 or 17)
- 1 alligator pinch clip (single or double prong)
- quick-drying glue or glue gun (with glue sticks)
- 2" by 1" piece of wax paper

### LAMB Says...

Since korker bows are heavy, special attention is needed when attaching them to an alligator pinch clip.

### Step-by-Step Illustrations



### Attaching Korker Bows to an Alligator Pinch Clip

- 1.** Turn the korker bow over and find the bottom most korker. This will be where you apply the clip. The length of the korker will help cover the clip.
- 2.** Place wax paper between the clip's prongs to help catch glue. Using either a glue gun or a quick-drying glue, apply a bead of glue along the length of the top surface of the clip.
- 3.** Line up your clip to the korker. Make sure the length of the clip runs along the length of the korker. Press and allow the glue to set.
- 4.** After the glue sets, remove the wax paper and wipe any excess glue that may have come in contact with the bottom prong. Wrap and bond any two neighboring korkers (coming from opposite sides) over and around the clip's **top** prong while making sure the korkers wrap around the center of the clip.
- 5.** Extending out from the tip of the clip is the excess ribbon you will use to cover the **top inside** of the clip. Trim the ribbon to 1 ¼" in length. Apply glue to the ribbon and bond it to the top inside of the clip's prong.
- 6.** Move to the other end of the clip and trim the ribbon coming off the end of the clip down to an 1" in length.
- 7.** Turn the clip over and apply glue to the bottom surface where you would pinch open the clip. Wrap ribbon around the clip and bond the ribbon to it. Wipe off excess glue that seeps out onto the clip before it sets.
- 8.** You have now securely attached your korker bow to the clip successfully. Enjoy your bow!
