



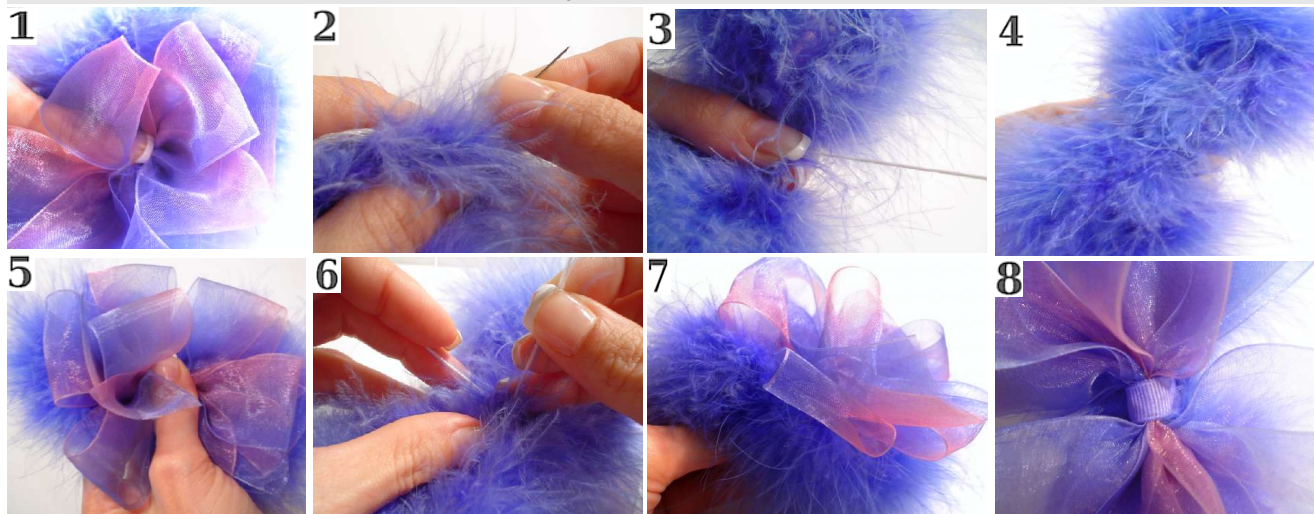
Materials for Stacking with Marabou:

- 1 (5") 8 loop bow
- 10" of marabou
- embroidery needle (size 5)
- 2 pieces of 8" floss
- 1 alligator pinch clip
- 1 center knot (page 7)

If you want a little fluff. Add marabou to any of your bows!

Step-by-Step Illustrations



Stacking with Marabou

- 1.** Holding the top bow, measure the amount of marabou needed by holding the end of the marabou to the bow's center and looping the marabou along the length of the bow. Bring the marabou back to the center of the bow and cut.
- 2.** Thread the floss onto needle. Tie a knot about 3" from the end. Starting at one end of the marabou, run the needle through the marabou about ½" from the end. Pull the floss through.
- 3.** Do the same with the other end. After both ends are threaded, hold the ends to the center of the marabou and wrap the floss twice around the center and ends. Pull tight and secure floss in place with a double knot. Dot knot with instant glue.
- 4.** You now have the bottom side of your bow.
- 5.** Stack the center of your bow directly **on top** of the center of the marabou and clip the two together.
- 6.** Using new floss, secure the centers together by wrapping floss around the centers twice. Pull the floss tight and tie into a double knot. Dot knot with instant glue and trim excess floss.
- 7.** Now you'll attach the bow to a clip. Simply slide the top prong of the clip through the floss that is wrapped around the center. Secure the bow's center to the clip with a glue gun.
- 8.** Wrap the center with your favorite knot (see pages 7 and 8 for making and applying center knots). We used a 3/8" ribbon wrapped around the bow and clip twice.
